#### Artist Spotlight: Interdisciplinary Initiator, Kelley Meister

"I see the arts as the center point of academics - all other disciplines can be mediated, experienced, explored, and digested through the arts. I think that arts education has the possibility to open up a



space to consider our ecological, social, economical context by working to reveal the complexity of our belief systems and the emotional responses that inform the decisions we choose to make. And for that reason, I believe it is indispensable."
